that was currently abiding with them in fleshly form but shall soon begin to dwell in them in spirit form and then he continued and said in verse 18 i will not leave you as orphans i will come to you this tells us that if we must walk with the holy spirit who himself is christ we must therefore be very sensitive to acknowledge his presence just like we can be able to acknowledge the presence of a fellow human been the same way he used to walk with his disciples before he died doing miracles and instructing them on what to do is the same way he is desiring to walk with anyone who recognizes his presence in that same capacity even scripture refers to the holy spirit as the spirit of jesus in acts 16 7 when it says when they came to the border of mysia they tried to enter bithynia but the spirit of jesus would not allow them to he is the same jesus in the person of the holy spirit this book was therefore written in order to help us walk with him
